Principal's Day at Queen's Park

Last week we held our annual Principal's Day at Queen's Park. Our Executive met with <u>28 MPPs</u> from the PC, NDP and Liberal Caucuses. It was part of our ongoing advocacy campaign to bring the concerns of school leaders to the attention of legislators, offer to be a resource to them in their work and hear what is happening in schools in their riding. We also took the opportunity to discuss our position paper on <u>Violent Incidents in Schools</u>.
