Seeking New ONE-T Employee Trustee

The 3 provincial principal associations (OPC, CPCO and ADFO) will, following a formal selection process, be jointly choosing a new Trustee representative for our provincial life and health benefits provider. The ONE-T Board is made up of nine Trustees, including four employer representatives from the government/school boards and five employee representatives (including the Chair) from the non-union employees. The Board is responsible for effectively managing ONE-T, including making a broad range of administrative and investment decisions. Open Enrolment for Members Without LTD Coverage

Have you previously been denied LTD coverage? Did you miss the initial 60-day window after your appointment to a P/VP position to apply for LTD coverage? Is LTD coverage a condition of employment (check your T&C agreement) but you are not currently covered for any reason?

In September, our Benefits Plan was transferred from Manulife Financial to Great-West Life. With this transfer, we were able to negotiate an <u>open enrolment</u> for Members who do not currently have LTD coverage under the OPC Benefits plan and would not otherwise be eligible for coverage. The deadline to apply is **November 30, 2018.** Once you are enrolled, premiums will be retroactive to September 1, 2018, the start of our policy contract with Great-West Life.
