Membership and Benefits Forms Due

If you are a newly appointed administrator, you must submit your OPC membership application forms within 60 calendar days of your appointment. If your appointment date was September 1, you must submit your application to our Membership Services by **October 31**. If you do not apply within 60 days, you will lose your historical legal coverage for any employment-related event or circumstance that arose or occurred prior to becoming an OPC Member.

Members in boards* participating in the OPC Benefits plan must also submit their Group Benefits application forms for Long Term Disability Insurance (LTDI) to us by **October 31, 2018.** Enrolment will be completed upon receipt of the original application forms and premiums will be retroactive to the date of appointment.

Medical evidence of insurability and Insurer's approval will be required if the application forms are received after October 31, 2018. Members who did not have LTDI coverage up to their date of appointment must submit medical evidence.
