Safe and Supportive Classrooms Act

Last week the Minister introduced <u>Bill 48</u>, *The Safe and Supportive Classrooms Act.* If passed, the bill will allow the government to determine the numbers of elected and appointed Council members at the Ontario College of Teachers, preserve the right to peer review for principals and vice-principals at the College, introduce a proficiency test in math for new teachers and suspend the teaching certificate of any educator found guilty of sexual abuse of a student.
