Negotiations Update

Last week, we provided an update to our Provincial Councillors, District Chairs and elected T&C representatives on the <u>Aurora case</u>, where the s. 2(d) rights of agricultural workers were addressed in a decision of the Divisional Court released in August. The principals' and vice-principals' associations (OPC, CPCO and ADFO) intervened in the case. We also provided an <u>update on provincial bargaining</u>. Ministry Memo – De-streaming

Last week the ministry sent <u>a memo regarding de-streaming</u>, confirming that as of September 2022, all Grade 9 subjects will be offered in one stream.
