Anti-bullying PPM

Last week the ministry released <u>PPM 144</u>, providing direction to school boards to support the development of plans, policies and guidelines that boards must establish to support bullying prevention and intervention in schools. Boards have until September 2022 to update their policies to align with these revisions. The revisions include updated descriptions of bullying and cyber bullying, and an equity alignment.
