Ontario College of Teachers Seeks Administrator Panelists

You may be aware that the Ontario College of Teachers continues a significant transformation (an initial call for transition positions occurred in spring 2021), and as part of that process, is inviting applications for a variety of positions to support its governance of the profession. Peer review – the assurance that the conduct of a principal or vice-principal will be adjudicated by at least one committee member who has worked as an administrator - is now law and required by the *Ontario College of Teachers Act*. In order for peer review to be meaningful, it is critical that there be robust participation of current or retired practising school leaders on the governing Council and serving on its Committees and roster of panelists, particularly and as a priority, on the Investigations, Discipline and Fitness to Practice Committees. It is for this reason that we share the information and application process.
