The data we collect will be used for our upcoming Advocacy Week with MPPs in early March, as well as for feedback we have been requested to provide to the Minister. We know all of you are dealing with this challenge almost daily in your schools. Please respond if you are currently working in a school. It will take you about 4 minutes and should not require you to look for any data. We are asking you to provide us with your best estimates regarding staff shortages, based on an average 5-day week in January. We also welcome any suggestions or recommendations you have to tackle this issue. Thank you for your prompt attention to this very important issue.
