People for Education Report

With input from principals and vice-principals across the province, today People for Education released a <u>Progress Report on Anti-Racism Policies Across Canada</u>. Included in the findings is that principals continue to struggle to implement vital new strategies with insufficient staff and resources, and while continuing to deal with the fall-out from the pandemic. The report also notes what appears to be some backsliding in Ontario education on what could have been effective anti-racism and equity policies. It recommends the need to name the problem, collect data and provide regular reports, and provide resources to support policy.
