In June 2023, the ministry will be appointing a new P/VP representative to sit on the Ministry's Advisory Council on Special Education (MACSE). The Council provides advice to the Minister of Education about the development and delivery of programs and services for students with special education needs, and advice on identifying and providing early intervention programs. Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action Presentation

Last November, Chief Cadmus Delorme, Chief of the Cowessess First Nation, presented on Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action as a part of our ongoing Professional Learning <u>Speaker Series</u>. Chief Delorme provided insight into what education leaders can do in support of all learners toward Truth and Reconciliation. There are two short clips from the presentation that outline the <u>goal of reconciliation</u> and the <u>definition of truth</u>. Are You Retiring This Year?

If you are retiring at the end of this school year, email membership@principals.ca with your retirement date so we can record your employment status change. Your school board does not share retirement information with us.

If you have LTD coverage, you are not eligible to maintain it after retirement. Complete and submit the <u>Application to Terminate LTD Coverage form</u> to <u>OPC Benefits</u>. Premiums are non-refundable. For boards where LTD is a condition of employment, proof of retirement will be required prior to termination. If you have optional insurance (life, accidental death and dismemberment), indicate on the <u>Application to Terminate or Maintain Optional Insurance</u> <u>Coverage form</u> whether you wish to terminate or maintain it. You can maintain this coverage up to age 70 if you become an OPC <u>Associate</u> or Term Member within 30 days of retiring. If your premiums were paid through payroll deduction, you'll need to complete the <u>Pre-authorized Debit Agreement</u> and submit a void cheque for premium withdrawal from your bank account.
