EDI Update

It was great to see so many attendees at the VP Symposium last week. Participants engaged in conversations about anti-oppressive leadership, wellness and building their professional network. The keynote speaker, Curtis Carmichael, a young Black educator and social entrepreneur, reinforced the importance of the work we are doing to build the capacity of administrators to engage in anti-oppressive leadership. Many attendees and workshop leaders were part of our EDI-based committees, sub-committees, affinity spaces and focus groups. This supports our work by creating opportunities for leaders with diverse identities to see themselves represented in, and as being part of, the OPC.

EDI Affinity Groups

International School Leadership within OPC

There has been an update to the operation for International School Leadership (ISL), initially created as a subsidiary of the OPC. An Advisory Group was formed by our Provincial Council to review ISL's business activities and determine the organizational direction. Following a recommendation by the Advisory Group, a motion to bring international work into the OPC as a distinct department was approved by Council. The Advisory Group identified <u>five goals that</u> responded to why it was important for the OPC to be involved in international work. Our staff continues to work with the Advisory Group and other partners on different aspects of international work, including identifying ways in which Members can be more involved.
