The House did not sit for Question Period last week.

MPP Ted Hsu (Liberal) introduced <u>Bill 108, An Act in Relation to Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder</u>. The bill would require school boards to develop a policy addressing FASD, and require teachers and early childhood educators to be taught about the signs and symptoms of FASD, as well as how to appropriately accommodate these children in the classroom.
