Last week, the three provincial P/VP associations sent a <u>submission to the ministry</u> in preparation for the 2023-24 Grants for Student Needs. This is a process in which the ministry seeks feedback from education stakeholder groups as it prepares for the prospective grant process. Our submission encourages an education funding model built on the essential principles of equity, advocacy, adequacy and accountability. It includes initiatives that support the reduction of administrative burdens, streamlined reporting and potential opportunities to find new efficiencies.

### **Queen's Park**

There were questions in the House last week about <u>future use of the Notwithstanding Clause in legislation</u>, post-secondary education and skills training, anti-Semitic incidents in schools, additional funding for education sector, negotiations with CUPE, lack of medication for First Nations children, masking in schools, eliminating interest on student debt, adequate funding for schools and <u>negotiations with CUPE</u>.

Lucille Collard (L) introduced Bill 37, the <u>Notwithstanding Clause Limitation Act</u>, which would prevent bills from invoking the Notwithstanding Clause except in certain circumstances.
