Council Meeting and AGM

Last week, we held our first Provincial Council meeting of the year, our Annual General meeting and our Awards Dinner. Councillors received the <u>AGM report</u> and the audited financial statements. Discussions were held about staff shortages, local negotiations, upcoming professional learning opportunities, our local advocacy campaign and planning for the OPC's 25th Anniversary in 2023. Highlights of the meeting will be sent to all Members later this week.

We are also pleased to share that, following an extensive hiring process managed by a national, executive search firm, Council voted to approve the Executive and Hiring Committee's recommendation that Dr. Nadine Trépanier-Bisson be the OPC's new Executive Director, effective December 6th, 2022. The ED transition is now underway and will continue through Allyson Otten's retirement at the end of December.

Finance Update - Fiscal Year 2021-22 Audit Process and Results

The OPC's fiscal year (FY) runs from July 1 – June 30. As a not-for-profit association, we are required to retain an accounting firm to conduct a full audit of our finances each year. RSM Canada LLP has conducted our audits for the past five years. The consolidated financial statements include the results of the OPC (Membership, Benefits, Professional Learning), ISL (International School Leadership) and PAP (Principal Association Projects). We are pleased to report that the OPC received a clean audit opinion, which was reviewed and approved by our Provincial Council on September 28th and received at the AGM on October 20, 2022. Our audited financial statements are available to Members in the Finances section of our website.
