Membership and Group Benefits Applications Due

All **newly appointed administrators** must submit their OPC <u>membership application</u> within 60 calendar days of their appointment. If your appointment date was effective September 1, 2022, you must submit your application to Membership Services by **October 31, 2022**. Failure to do so will result in a loss of historical protective services coverage for any employment-related event or circumstance that arose or occurred prior to becoming an OPC Member. Members in boards* participating in the OPC Benefits plan must also submit their <u>Group Benefits application</u> for Long-term Disability Insurance (LTDI) by **October 31, 2022**. Premiums will be retroactive to the date of appointment. Medical evidence of good health and Insurer's approval will be required if the application forms are received after October 31, 2022. Members who did not have LTDI coverage up to their date of appointment must submit medical evidence. For more information, contact opcbenefits@principals.ca.
