## **Student Investigations Tip Sheet**

A P/VP will, from time to time, need to conduct investigations into alleged student conduct for which a suspension, expulsion or some other form of corrective action must be considered. Our PST has developed a <u>Tip Sheet</u> that provides guidance and advice leading up to, during and following student investigations. Throughout the process, P/VPs must ensure procedural fairness, remain neutral and act fairly in preparing reports and providing recommendations with respect to next steps, including corrective action. At times, investigations have been used in a discriminatory and oppressive manner against certain identity groups. Conducting fair and unbiased investigations is both fundamental to the rights of students and essential to the school leader's ability to respond to questions and appeal processes. When in doubt, seek support and advice from your supervisory officer and other senior board officials. Contact our PST for professional and legal advice, support and representation.
