Staff Shortages Survey Results and Statement

Following the survey we conducted in late September, we have developed a <u>summary of the feedback</u> we received from over 900 OPC Members. Last week, we put out a <u>public statement</u> summarizing the data, and offering recommendations for addressing this ongoing and critical issue. The recommendations came from feedback received in the poll and from discussions at our October Provincial Council meeting. We also shared this information with the Minister's Office and the Deputy Minister in a meeting last week. We will continue to look for solutions and to advocate on your behalf to try to resolve this problem.

Tip Sheet: Complaints Made to the OCT

The OCT is the regulatory body for Ontario teachers, principals and vice-principals. OPC Members may become the subject of complaints to the OCT of alleged misconduct. While the College, in its discretion, can refuse to investigate a complaint, if it does proceed with an investigation, a PST lawyer will work with you to prepare and submit a response. While most complaints get resolved at the investigation stage, in some cases the matter may continue to either the Discipline or Fitness to Practice Committee for a hearing. If you become aware that a complaint has been filed against you, contact our Protective Services Team immediately for assistance and representation.
