Staff Shortages Poll

In February, we conducted a poll on staff shortages so that we would have accurate information to provide to the Minister about how shortages are affecting you, schools and students. As we begin a new school year, we are hearing that those staffing issues continue to cause challenges in schools. As such, we would like to repeat that poll, to once again have accurate up-to-date data directly from schools. <u>Here is the poll</u> we are asking you to complete by Sunday, October 1. Please respond only if you are currently working in a school. It will take you about 4 minutes and should not require you to look for any data. We are asking you to provide us with your best estimates regarding staff shortages, based on an average week in September. Thank you for your prompt attention to this very important issue.
