#### **Ministry Updates**

Last week, the ministry released a <u>memo updating continuity of learning</u> during the school closure period. It addresses the desire for more synchronous learning, access to technology, professional development, summer learning and communicating with parents. The government has also <u>approved an emergency order</u> that would enable school board employees to be redeployed, voluntarily, to help out in hospitals long-term care homes, retirement homes and women's shelters while the pandemic continues. Finally, we are expecting an announcement this week about the date for school re-openings.
