Media Survey About Student Violence

In October, the media reported on a survey conducted among Canadian youth related to violent incidents in schools. While very concerning, the results were not surprising to principals and vice-principals. Many of you have noted an increase in the number and severity of such incidents. And many serious incidents that originate in the community are increasingly moving into our schools. Today, we sent a <u>letter to the Minister</u> to give some context to the media reports and to reiterate our call for recommendations to address this situation.

Important Information About Leaves of Absence

Principals and vice-principals are entitled to all of the statutory leaves set out in the *Employment Standards Act (ESA)* and, in addition, have some superior rights that have been negotiated in their Terms and Conditions (T&C) agreements. This <u>tip sheet</u> summarizes your leave entitlements both under the ESA and the provincially negotiated elements of the T&C agreements. Your local T&C agreements may also specify additional leave entitlements.
