### **Survey on COVID-19 Virus and Vaccines**

### **Policy Renewal for Group Insurance Benefits Plan**

Each year, we review the financial performance of the group insurance benefits plan (LTD, optional life, accidental death & dismemberment) and renegotiate the premiums with the insurer, Canada Life. Our primary responsibility is to obtain the most cost-effective premiums for you, relative to usage. The insurer is required by law to ensure that sufficient funds are available to pay the current claims and that appropriate reserves are held to fund the duration of each claim.

We have finalized the negotiation for the premium rates for the upcoming policy year (September 1, 2021 to August 31, 2022). The insurer had proposed an increase of 5.9% for LTD premiums. We are pleased to advise that as a result of service efficiencies and cost savings associated with the administration of the LTD Plan, your LTD premiums will not be increased for the upcoming policy year. The increase in rates will be covered by the LTD Plan revenue. Our Provincial Council approved this as part of our 2021-2022 budget.

The insurer is not requiring any rate changes for Optional Life and AD&D coverages. However, there will be an age-band increase where applicable. More information will be provided in an upcoming benefits advisory.
