PPM 165 Teacher Hiring

Last week the ministry released a memo on Policy/Program Memorandum 165 on <u>Teacher Hiring Practices</u>, which comes into effect on March 31, 2021. This is the date for school boards to adopt and post their own teacher hiring policies. The PPM outlines provincial expectations for establishing teacher hiring policies and processes to help strengthen Ontario's teacher workforce.
