There were questions in the House last week about <u>degree granting for Canada Christian</u> <u>College</u>, <u>mental health support for education workers</u>, <u>collapsed classes due to pandemic</u>, additional supports to boards during pandemic and lack of supports for autism.

MPP Daryl Kramp (PC) introduced Bill 216, <u>Food Literacy for Students Act</u>. It would require that curriculum be developed in food literacy education and healthy eating for students in grades 1-12, including providing opportunities for students to grow, prepare and learn about local foods.
