Membership and Group Benefits Forms Due

Newly appointed administrators must submit their <u>OPC membership application form</u> within 60 calendar days of appointment. If your appointment date was Sept 1, you must submit this by **October 31** to avoid a loss of historical protective services coverage for any employment-related event that occurred prior to becoming an OPC Member. Members in boards* participating in our Benefits plan must also submit their <u>Group Benefits</u> <u>application</u> for Long Term Disability Insurance (LTDI) by **October 31.** If your application is not received by October 28 or has outstanding items, the first premium withdrawal will likely occur in December for four months. Medical evidence of insurability and Insurer's approval will be required if forms are late. Members who did not have LTDI coverage up to their date of appointment must submit medical evidence.
