Civil Liabilities and Health & Safety Tip Sheets

While the demands of your role are continuously changing, COVID-19 has added a layer of complexity leading to more stress and anxiety, particularly for questions around civil liability. It is your responsibility (liability) to ensure that the school environment and all school activities are reasonably safe. You can't always control what happens under your supervision resulting in harm or injury to others, and the question of liability will focus on whether you were negligent in the discharge of your duties. Our PST has prepared a Tip Sheet on <u>Civil Liabilities</u> to help you understand civil liability concepts, and we encourage you to review your right to a legal defence and indemnification outlined in your Terms and Conditions Agreement. It is reassuring to know that school boards have comprehensive liability insurance and P/VPs are covered by those policies, so long as they were acting in the course of their employment duties and in good faith – even if there was some negligence that led to harm.

We also encourage you to be mindful of your own personal health and wellness during this time. If you are feeling overwhelmed, stressed or anxious, there are concrete steps you can and should take to manage.
