In addition to the many changes school administrators have had to navigate with the reopening of schools this fall, principals and vice-principals must also familiarize themselves and implement current Suspension and Expulsion regulations, and work toward establishing biasfree progressive discipline from JK to Gr. 12 as part of <u>Ontario's Action Plan to Address Systemic Racism in Schools</u>. Our PST has updated the tip sheet on <u>Student Behaviour and Discipline</u> to incorporate the changes, and we would also urge you to refer to the resource developed by the Ministry of Education/Ontario Human Rights Commission <u>Supporting Bias-Free Progressive</u> <u>Discipline in Schools: A Resource Guide for School and System Leaders</u>.
